### CURRICULUM DAY - FRIDAY 11th MAY

This Friday will be the second curriculum day where staff will continue training with a specific focus on our reading program. We will continue to develop our understanding of the Fountas & Pinnell resource and our daily literacy programs.

### TESTING

As teachers begin preparing for mid-year reports (which will be sent home during the last week), student testing is beginning to take place. These assessments are used to track student learning, set learning goals and individual learning plans and guide curriculum delivery. Please ask your children about how they are going and they may have result scores, levels or new skills to focus on.

Teachers are always more than happy to share results and future learning directions. If you would like to have a discussion, please arrange a suitable time.

### **NAPLAN**

The National school testing program takes place next week between 15th-17th of May. A note explaining the testing is provided with today's newsletter for all students in years 3 and 5.

Students will be tested in the areas of Reading, Writing, Language Conventions and Mathematics. This is our proposed timetable –

### SCHOOL WIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOURS

The SWPB for this week continues our theme of Responsibility in our Learning spaces with the focus "Right speed, right place" Teachers will be focusing on movement around classrooms, open space and buildings. The emphasis will be on how we move from room to room and the appropriate and safe places to run. Students are rewarded for displaying our values of Excellence, Responsibility and **Respect**. Our new online rewards system - Vivo has commenced this week. Teachers will allocate points to students who display our values and then students will be able to log in and check their points and exchange them for rewards from the online shop. Student log-in details will be available soon and parents/ guardians can also log in and check how their children are progressing and what they are getting points for.

### **AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS - FOUNDATION STUDENTS**

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) is a population-based measure of how children in Australia have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school. Teachers complete a research tool, the Australian version of the Early Development Instrument (the Instrument). The Instrument measures five key areas, or

- physical health and wellbeing
- social competence
- emotional maturity
- •language and cognitive skills (school-based) and
- communication skills and general knowledge

domains, of early childhood development:

These areas are closely linked to the predictors of adult health, education and social outcomes. The Council of Australian Governments (COAG) has endorsed the AEDC as a national progress measure of early childhood development in Australia.

In the coming weeks, Mrs Hines will conduct this survey with our Foundation students. The survey will take about 20 minutes to complete with each child. For more information, please see the handout provided with this newsletter.

### **CHICKENPOX**

We have had a reported case of Chickenpox at the Ross Creek campus. Please see your doctor if you have any of the following symptoms or if you have any concerns.

- •low-grade fever
- •general discomfort, illness or lack of wellbeing (malaise)
- •intensely itchy skin rash -- appears as small blisters surrounded by irregularly-shaped patches of
- •Inflamed skin. The blisters first form on the body and later on the head and limbs. They usually burst and develop
- •crusts after about five days
- •ulcers may develop.

For chickenpox, the time from infection to the appearance of the rash (incubation period) is around 14 to 16 days.

A few days before the appearance of the rash, the person may feel feverish and have a sore throat and headache.

The skin may be marked for some months after the rash has cleared.

### WOADSTOCK—OUR SCHOOL,OUR HOME




